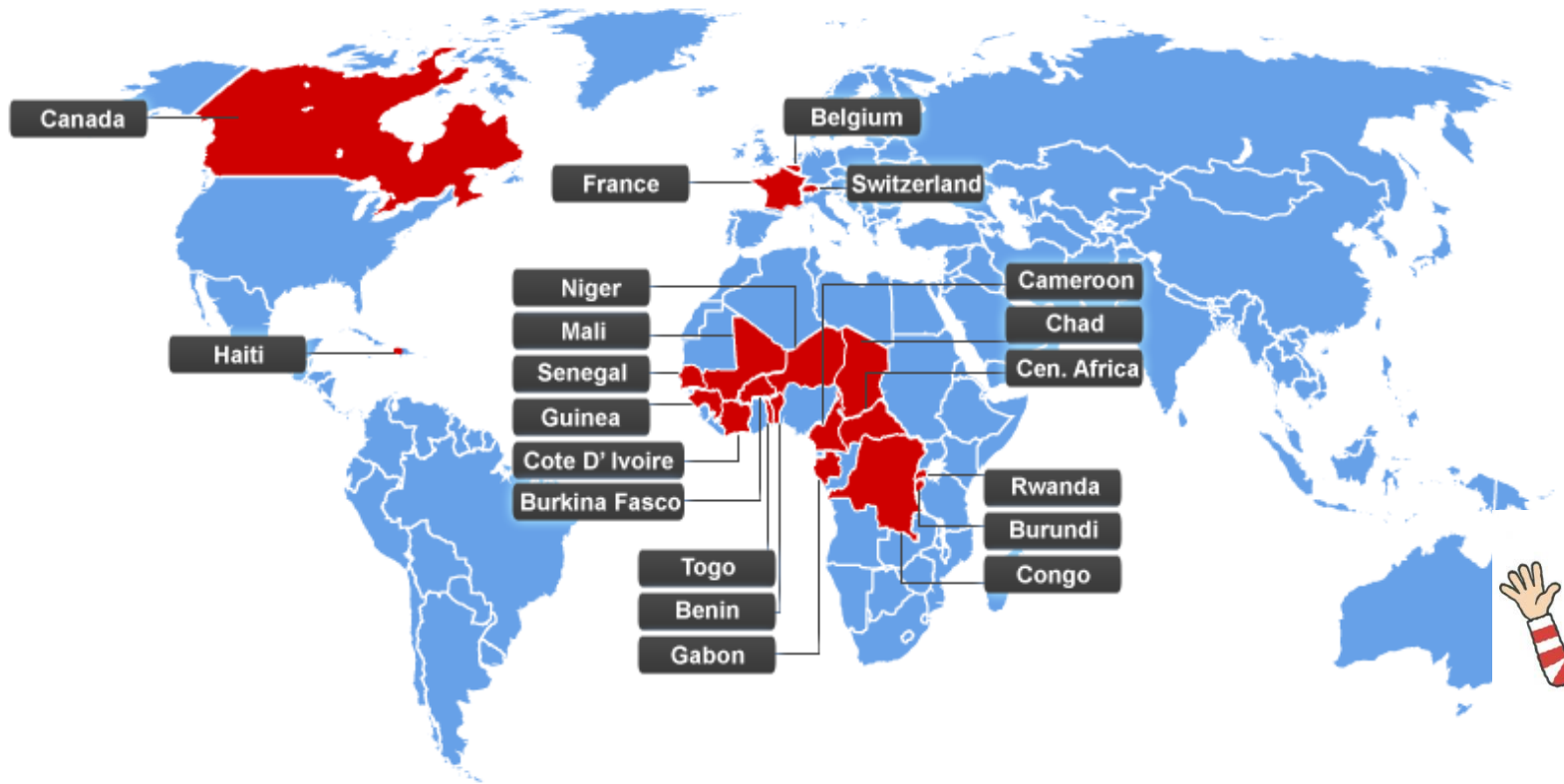

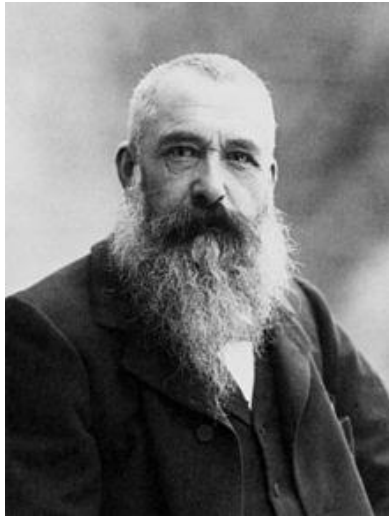

Claude Monet

Claude Monet was the founder of the impressionist movement. He was focused on capturing movement and changing light and colour in his paintings, and was less concerned with realism. He wanted to paint how humans look upon a scene, rather than what is actually there. Paintings by Claude Monet now sell for tens of millions of pounds. He produced more than 1000 individual paintings during his career.

Coco Chanel

A French fashion powerhouse who became famous for her iconic suits, perfumes, and little black dresses. She taught herself to sew after she was orphaned, and turned that skill into a formidable fashion empire. Chanel No. 5, her signature scent, is a bestselling perfume the world over.
