*The first activity you need to undertake is to find a fresh page in your book and set out your planning template. Use a ruler and pencil and take your time.*

*The first section we need to plan is our title.  
Remember it is a biography so lets keep it  
simple.*

- The life of Brunel*
- Isambard Kingdom Brunel*
- Brunel, the great engineer.*


*Now we need to write a simple introduction. Our introduction will cover 3 facts and nothing more. These include.*

First let's plan our Early life section. Head back to your work from Thursday 28th January. Here you will find at least 3 sentences, your first sentence should be similar to the one below


① Isambard Kingdom Brunel, was born in Portsmouth, England on the 9th April 1806, before long he and his family moved to London.

Next to the sentence you will now need to write a number one next to it in the margin, this tells us that it's our first sentence that we will use tomorrow when we write up our final piece.

Now that you have found your first sentence you need to go to your plan under the early life section and put in another number one, now you can follow your plan to find the right number in the book which tells you which sentence you are writing down.

Now you need to go back to the early life section in your book and in the margin label 2 more sentences as ② and ③. Remember they need to be in chronological order.

- Sentence ② should be about going to study in France
- Sentence ③ should be about starting his first engineering job in London.

Once you have found 2 and 3 in your book add the numbers to your plan like this.

# Life as an engineer

This section has another 3 sentences all written on the 28th January. As with the first section you need to go into your book and identify 3 more sentences for your plan, these sentences will be labelled 4, 5 and 6 in the margin.

*Sentence 4 - About the tunnel under the River Thames.*

*Sentence 5 - About working for the Great Western Railway company.*

*Sentence 6 - Working for the Great Western shipping company.*

Once you have found 4, 5 and 6 in your book add the numbers to your plan like this.

# Key achievements


This section has another 3 sentences all written on the 28th January. As with the first section you need to go into your book and identify 3 more sentences for your plan, these sentences will be labelled 7, 8 and 9 in the margin.

*Sentence 7 - About the Clifton Suspension bridge*

*Sentence 8 - About designing the Ship the S.S Great Eastern.*

*Sentence 9 - About Paddington station*

Once you have found 7, 8 and 9 in your book add the numbers to your plan like this.




