

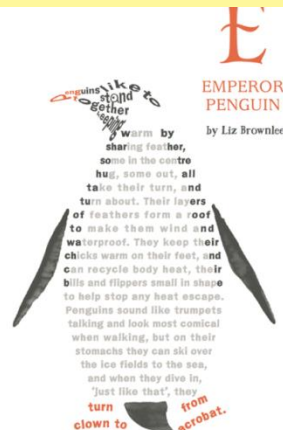

extending my heart always.



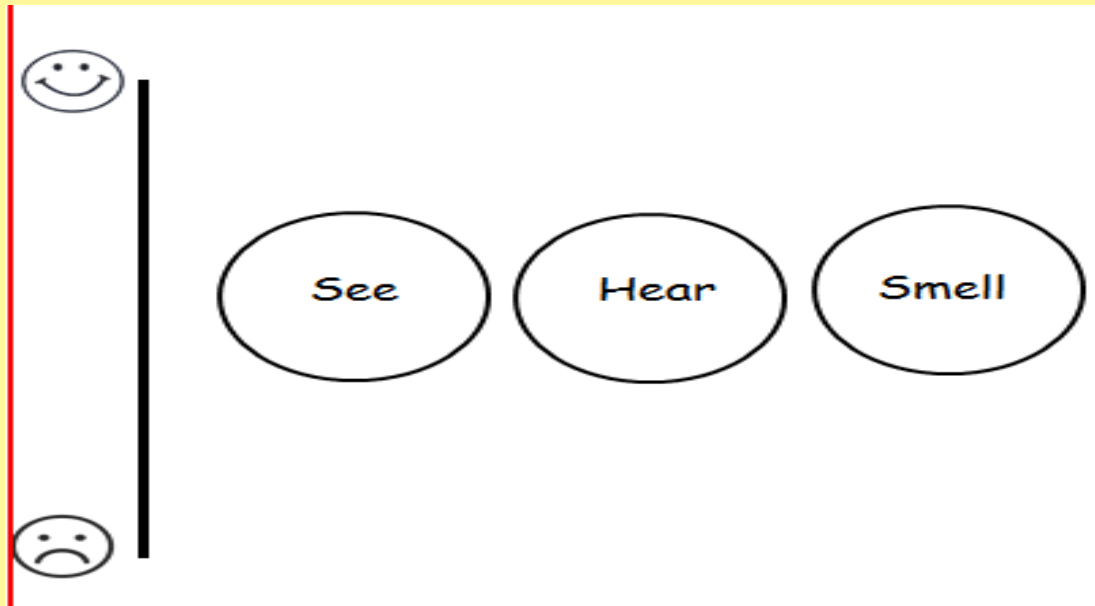
In a twist
