Reliability

On many internet websites, anybody can post anything and claim it to be true. How do you know you can trust what you read on the internet? How can you double check if it is true?



<u>Reliability</u>

- Ask an adult for help
- Check offline sources
- Question what you see online
- Check other more reliable online sources.



What we read online can easily influence our decisions and opinions. This can lead to making wrong choices that can effect ourselves or others. That is why it is important that we explore and question the reliability of what we see and hear online.



How can I keep myself safe online?

- Question if it is true or false
- Investigate who wrote it
- Enquire why it was written
- Only share reliable sources with others
- Ask an adult for help if I am unsure

Scenario 1
