#### Task 1

Your next task is an opportunity to go and carry out some of your own research. Look online or in books at home for any more interesting facts about electricity, North America or technology.

- What are some famous landmarks of North America?
- How many people in the world have access to the internet?
- What kind of technology could we see in the future?






#### Task 3

Our final job today will be to set up our double page spread. Firstly, draw the timeline seen below across the bottom of your double page spread, showing 1800s, 1900s and 2000s.












#### Task 3

Next, draw buildings in the background to show the development of the sizes of buildings. I've chosen to represent the development of New York City over time with a small building, then the Empire State Building and then finally the World Trade Centre. Do this **LIGHTLY** as it is part of your background and you'll be writing over the top. Do it faintly and with colour pencils, not pens.












#### Task 3

Finally, plan where you're going to put your different paragraphs of information. My following example also shows sub-headings if you need some help thinking what to focus your writing on. I've drawn my boxes, however I'd recommend drawing your box after you've written your paragraph so you're not trying to squeeze your information into boxes.
