LO To write a set of instructions



Today, we are going to use our plan to write up our set of instructions for making rainbow fruit skewers.

When we have a plan, it is always important to use all the ideas we have had and put into our writing.



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Remember the features of a set of instructions?

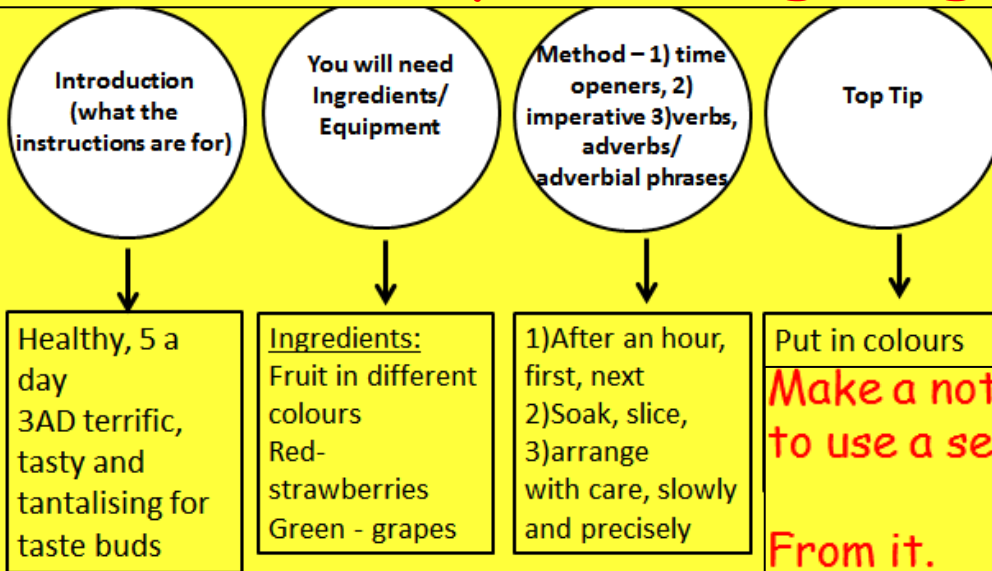
- An introduction to explain what the instructions are for
- A You will need subheading
- List of ingredients
- List of equipment
- Bullet points/numbers
- A Method subheading
- Steps with time openers/imperative verbs
- Adverbs and adverbial phrases

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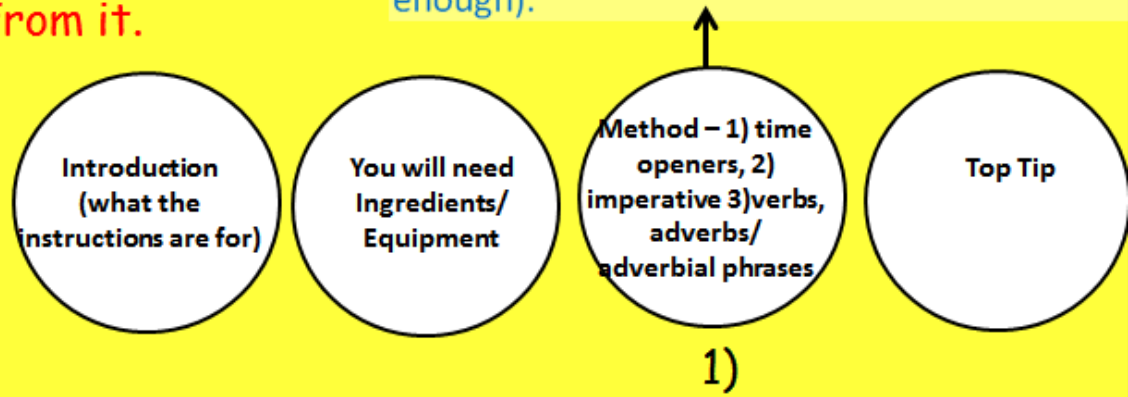


Go over your plan - do you now know which sentences you are going to use?



Make a note in your work from last week if you want to use a sentence 1) First, soak your fruit in a bowl of lemon juice and water (about an hour should be long enough).

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When you begin your instructions with an introduction, remember you don't need a subheading for this!

Check your plan and look at this introduction from your sentence work last week.

If you want to enjoy a tasty, tantalising treat that is also healthy, then read on.

Can you write a better introduction?

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Top Tip - don't forget to include one at the end.

It can be as simple as:

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Success Criteria

Write up your instructions in this order:

- Introduction
- A 'You will need list' including ingredients and equipment
- 'Method' including time openers, imperative verbs and step with adverbs /adverbial phrases
- A 'TOP TIP'

Write up a recipe review - imagine you have made and eaten this recipe, include descriptive sense words that relate to the experience of eating them.
