Today, we are going to edit and improve our set of instructions for making rainbow fruit skewers.

Remember the features of a set of instructions?

Success Criteria

- An introduction to explain what the instructions are for
- A You will need subheading
- List of ingredients
- List of equipment
- Bullet points/numbers
- A Method subheading
- Steps with time openers/imperative verbs/adverbs and adverbial phrases

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Spend 8 minutes on reading your instructions through-keep looking at the punctuation.

Have you used Capital letters and full stops correctly?

Check your commas after your time openers and imperative verbs too!

Punctuation

Have you used commas before a conjunction?

The dog was hungry, so he ate a bone.

Have you used a comma after your fronted adverbials?

After a while, the crowds parted.

Have you used two commas to mark a relative clause?

The dog, who was called Dexter, ran away.

Does every sentence finish with a full stop?

? ! . , ...

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Spend 8 minutes on reading your instructions through-keep looking at the spellings. **Have you spelled all your words correctly?** If you are not sure, check in a dictionary or ask an adult for help.

Spelling

Have you checked all your spellings?

Use a dictionary—don't guess—use a spelling voice.

Look out for simple errors—remember your spelling rules

...is it tion or sion?

Is it cious or tious?

Do I need to double the consonant? Is the vowel lonely?

Furry, Happy, Discussion, Dinner

Change the y to an 'i and add es



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Spend 8 minutes on reading your instructions through-keep looking at the word choice. If you don't have an actual thesaurus, you may have access to a tablet or P.C. that has the thesaurus option on word. **Can you check your vocabulary? Can you choose better words/phrasing?**

Is your vocabulary up to a Year 4 standard?


Cold—perished, finger-numbing,
